In response to the questionnaires we will now make the following a priority:

Review classroom environments focusing on noise levels.

Further develop a culture of ensuring that all children know its ok to get things wrong.

Review the structure of school assemblies and focus on external celebrations.

Deploy more staff during lunchtime and review the range of activities to further improve play.

Further develop the use of key vocabulary and modelling of language during lessons.
